The robins were tired of being chased.


Chickens knew to run from foxes.

So the fox easily chased the robins.






Crow did not like this plan. He knew that robins ate worms from the dirt. "Robins must walk on the ground," he said.





Finally, Owl said, "Let robins hop on both feet."

"Robins' tracks will not look like chickens' tracks if they hop," Owl said.






Chickens would walk with one toot atter the other. Foxes would not get confused.


